Fostering provides animals with a safe, calm environment where they can relax, build confidence, and develop important social skills. It also helps reduce stress within the shelter by freeing up space and allowing us to support more animals in need. Many fostering opportunities are available, and we will work with you to find a placement that matches your comfort level and experience.

All foster animals remain under the care of the Gananoque & District Humane Society. The shelter is responsible for all required veterinary care during the foster period.

Our Foster Process:

- Application is received and reviewed by the Foster Program Director
- Approved applicants will be contacted to schedule a meet-and-greet at the shelter
- Suitable foster matches are discussed based on your home environment and experience
- A pickup time is arranged and a foster agreement is signed
- Ongoing communication is encouraged—we love updates and photos from our foster homes

Please note, the Gananoque & District Humane Society reserves the right to decline any application. Due to the volume of applications, we are unable to provide specific reasons for refusals.
